

# Digitization station

Use the Digitization Station to convert photos, negatives, slides, family videos, cassette tape recordings, and more into digital formats. The station also offers a variety of creative multimedia software allowing users to edit their media files.

## Booking the digitization station

Users may reserve the digitization station for up to 3 hours at a time. Please note that the station is self-guided, and staff can only answer basic questions. If you would like help getting familiar with the digitization station, staff can provide an orientation upon request. An orientation typically takes 15–45 minutes, depending on what you plan to do. Orientations can be provided for digitizing and for multimedia software use. For a digitization orientation, we will walk you through the equipment and digitize an item together. For a multimedia software orientation, we will show you the basics of how to use photo editing, video editing, audio editing, or file conversion software. To use the station independently afterward, you will need basic computer skills.

## **Formats you can digitize**

*Please note: You can only digitize materials if you hold the copyright for them. You may not digitize commercially produced movies, TV shows, or music albums.*

- Photos and negatives
- Film (35mm, medium format, 4x5 inch)
- VHS tapes (NTSC and non-commercial only)
- 35mm slides and film strips
- Super 8 or 8mm reel-to-reel film (Does not include 8mm or DV tapes for camcorders\*)
- Audio cassette tapes (non-commercial only)

\*Camcorder tapes can be digitized only if you bring a camcorder that can play the tapes. The camcorder must be functioning, and must have an RCA or S-Video output cable.
